# Organization

The PMI Global Volunteer Summit took place from the 14th to the 17th of March in Madrid (Spain). This summit has gathered 170 volunteers from around the world. The event was themed "Together We Can."

The summit was a mix of formal presentations by PMI about the strategy, panel discussions, workshops, working sessions in volunteer teams, and delicious networking lunches and fun parties.

#### Message from PMI CEO and President (Pierre Le Manh)

Pierre Le Manh, PMI CEO, and President could not attend the summit in Madrid as he had to fly to China to renew the agreement between China authorities and PMI - a strategic activity for PMI. He, however, had recorded a video for the audience about his thoughts and the organization's current and future. Presenting the new PMI organization and the main pillars, his e-presence was insightful for the global PMI volunteer community assembled.

PMI Strategy Panel discussion (Lenka Pincot, Brantlee Underhill, Mark Broome) gave insight into PMI's overall strategy, Short Term Value Initiatives (STVIs), and more. The session was followed by questions and answers from the audience, including questions about the current and future of PMI's strides.

Organizations are adopting approaches to enhance project outcomes by concentrating on delivering value to the customer. This shift from traditional delivery models has resulted in transforming the Project Management Office (PMO). In their multiple forms, PMOs can be termed as xMOs to suit varied needs and purposes.

# Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion

Two interesting topics were discussed.

Shola Kaye shared two frameworks for creating psychological safety and intersectionality in your teams. Shola also guided the attendees through a practical exercise on applying these concepts of power and privilege and headwinds versus tailwinds. The workshops helped the group understand the concept and gave ideas on the tactical and practical application of the same in daily life.

The closing keynote by the international generational expert, Henry Rose Lee, was highly insightful; where Lee focused on the importance of age diversity and how it can positively impact innovation, collaboration, and even revenue. The session was informational in busting a few generational myths fostering engagement with the tiers of generations that the professional spaces are made up of. In today's world, with a mix of teams from baby

boomers to generation alpha, the session delivered tips and tricks on how to make a successful relationship for value delivery.

**Madrid for Refugees** (Laura Davidson, Manager, Societal Engagement and Impact, PMI, introduced Meredith Moore, Donations Coordinator, Madrid for Refugees)

PMI has partnered with Madrid for Refugees, a local non-profit, volunteer-run organization dedicated to helping and empowering individuals who are refugees, asylum seekers, stateless, and migrants in need of international protection and at risk of social exclusion. Each of the volunteers wrote a note and prepared one kit bag. It was emotional. These kits provide the basics to help individuals and families make a fresh start in their new homes and help get some of the more costly basics covered so that they can approach the task of getting settled, starting school, looking for work, and making connections in the community in comfort and with confidence.

#### Beyond the presentations....

The opening reception initiated a camaraderie between the volunteers. Over a flamenco dance performance by a local group and cocktail dinner, the team of global volunteers was seen bonding with their team members, PMI staff, and other volunteers.

Intentional networking lunches helped us eat with different peers and learn more about their volunteering roles and lives. Volunteering is all about fostering connections to create enjoyable and fruitful work together.

It's said that our paths cross for a purpose. PMI creates that opportunity for people's paths to cross for the greater good of society and the planet. About 170 volunteers from over 56 countries representing 20 volunteer teams had a chance to interact on various topics from ethics to technology.

This is an incredible opportunity to meet people we have exchanged with by email in person. It is a way to build deep relationships and find familiar friends. That happened to Deepa and Yasmina, both contributors to PMWorld Journal. Their exchanges at the PMI Global Volunteer Summit led them to a new collaboration to share how effective volunteering is in making an impact.
